General Forensic Analyst Licensing Exam II Pilot

June 8, 2022 @ 2022 TDIAI Educational Conference in San Antonio, TX

Details

To aid in the development of the General Forensic Analyst Licensing Exam II, the Forensic Science Commission will host a pilot exam session at the 2022 Texas Division of the International Association for Identification annual educational conference on June 8, 2022. In anticipation of its



voluntary licensure programs for the following disciplines: forensic anthropology, document examination, crime scene investigation (any forensic practitioner involved in the location, identification, collection or preservation of physical evidence at a crime scene); crime scene reconstruction, latent print processing and examination, digital evidence (including computer forensics, audio, or imaging), and breath specimen testing, limited to analysts who perform breath alcohol calibrations, the Commission is first

offering the pilot option to practitioners in these disciplines.

Exam Credit

The exam is one required component to licensure in any forensic discipline. If a pilot participant passes the pilot exam, the participant will not have to take the test again when they apply for licensure. If a participant fails the exam, the attempt will not count against the regular three attempts allotted for examinees. The exam consists of 120 multiple choice questions. The appropriate cut-off/passing score will be determined by the Commission's contracted psychometricians and is based on the overall results of pilot participants. Participants will have up to four hours to complete the test. For further preparation instructions and exam details, please see the GFALE II syllabus.
