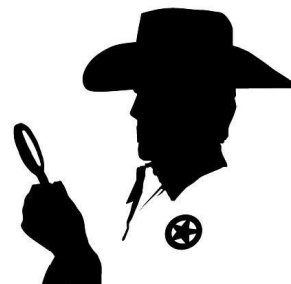

ABOUT THE INSTRUCTOR: MICHAEL S. MALONEY, SPECIAL AGENT (RET.)

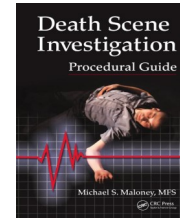
